





Regarding an article carried by the Associated Press a week ago, I will state that at no time have I ever asked to be recognized by the Oregon Baptist State Convention, and there are more than twenty five thousand Baptist preachers in the Southern Baptist Convention never will ask to be recognized by any group which is a part of the Northern Convention. The truth of the matter is that I refused to recognize them.. For more than twenty years

without their recognition I have managed to get along pretty well, the Lord seeing fit to bless my poor humble efforts by allowing me to build nine church buildings., welcoming more than two thousand for church membership, holding fifty two revival meetings. Eleven preachers going into the ministry who are now preaching, under my ministry, most of them converted in services I had the honor of conducting.

I was allowed to serve my country over seas during the war; I had the honor of receiving a degree from the President of the United States. Am still being recognized by large con-gregations and I believe by the Lord. I prefer this rather than being recognized by a self appointed and perpetuating machine, many of whose members have not preached a sermon or led a soul to Christ for years.

I challenge any Baptist preacher in Oregon to match this record and I say it humbly. AS TO MY WRECKING THE LOCAL BAPTIST CHURCH.

These are the facts. When I became pastor here the congregation would not exceed one hundred and fifty people, Sunday school about two hundred and fifty, one young people's organization, building in bad condition without paint brush for fourteen years, no modern Sunday school plant.

Sunday school plant. Last Sunday morning 527 people in English Baptist Sunday school, 768 people in morn-ing congregations at preaching service, five young people's organizations, three preachers preaching. Two of these preachers would not have had their present job in beautiful Salem had it not been for me, and I am glad that they are here, I am sure that they are both good men, and if the churches are wise they will trat them right and try to keep them. The First Baptist church became a mother inder my ministry, and to become a mother for the first time at such a ripe old age could not help but be painful, but the child seems to be deing well, and the mother will live.

If all the money and efforts that professed christians use to fight each other would be used to fight the Devil, I am sure God would be better pleased, and mankind could believe that
