BISHOP LOWE IS SPEAKER

Honorary Doctor of Divinity Degree Goes to Wilbert Dowson

Led by an imposing and colorful array of professors and trustees, members of the graduating class of Willamette university Monday marched to the concluding service of their college days to receive the degrees of bachelor of arts and bachelor of laws. Commencement exercises were held at the First Methodist church.

The commencement address by Bishop Titus E. Lowe of Portland was an earnest plea for the abolishment of race prejudice, hatred and antagonism.

"Each race has contributions that the other cannot afford to ignore, and the lowering of the bars of race prejudice is essential to each race of peoples," he said. He stressed education as the principal method of attaining this end and commended the members of the class upon their attainments during their days at college.

President Carl Gregg Dowson presented bachelor of arts degrees to 67 graduates of the college of liberal arts, bachelor of laws to 18 from the college of law, and a music diploma to Helene Price, graduate of the school of music. An honorary degree of doctor of divinity was bestowed upon Rev. Wilbert Dowson, of Portland, by Dr. Doney. Numerous honors and prizes were granted to students during the hour.

Woman Is Singer Of Traditional Song

To Lillian Scott went what is considered one of the highest honors granted at commencement time, the singing of the traditional "Farewell Willamette" by Irvine. She is the second woman to be accorded this honor. Other numbers on the program were, piano solo, "Capriccio F. Minor," Helene Price; vocal solo, "Even Bravest Hearts," John Crnkovich; scripture lesson, Rev. T. H. Temple; prayers and postlude, Professor T. S. Roberts.

Women received the lion's share of the prizes this year. Among the new members in Alpha Kappa Nu, national scholastic honorary, not a single man's name appears. The eight women elected to the society are Elsie Allen, Lydia Childs, Katherine Everett, Donna Hildesheim, Helen Hughes, Frances McGilvra, Marian Morange, and Marjorie Nelson.

Marian Morange was chosen to receive the Albert prize of \$25, donated by J. H. Albert of Salem, and class of 1919 scholarship prize of \$10. Harold Hauk was also the winner of two honors, the Colonel Percy Willis prize of \$25, and the J. H. Booth athletic prize, a new award this year. All are honors for high scholastic standing, character and wholesome influence, with the exception of the last, which is granted on a basis of high scholastic standing and prominence in athletics during the last year.

Departmental Honors Are Announced

Departmental honors went to Lydia Childs and Marjorie Nelson for high scholastic standing and special work in excess of graduation requirements. The Burghardt prize of \$25 to the outstanding student in calculus was awarded to Marjorie Moser, a junior next year.

Lydia Childs won the \$10 award given by Dr. B. L. Steeves for outstanding work in Latin, while Bertha Babcock, junior, and Cecile Adams, sophomore, received the Mrs. B. L. Steeves prize of \$10 for excellence in cooking and sewing.

The Keyes prize for oratory was given to Roy Harland, first, and Lillian Beecher, second. Members of the winning debate team which received a university award of \$10 were Lillian Beecher, Barney Cameron, Charles Campbell, Florence Becker, Roy Harland, Ray Latky, Ralph McCallough, and Marjorie Nelson. Ray Latky and Marian Morange also received speaking awards, the former for the winning of the tryout for the Oregon Old Line contest and the latter for the peace contest.

BORISSOFF HEARD IN CONCERT HERE

A capacity house greeted Josef Borissoff, concert master of the Los Angeles Philharmonic orchestra, as he appeared on the stage of Waller hall, Willamette university, Monday night. Mr. Borissoff presented a violin program which probably has never been surpassed in Salem.

A short, slight man, with slightly graying hair, quick of gesture, commanded the silent attention of his audience by a vibrant fire of his playing, a fire which was modulated from the warm, softly sweet notes of Chopin's "Nocturne in D flat major," into the powerful suppressed, smooth undulations of "Symphonie Espagnole" op. 21 by Edouard Lalo; and then into the fire of his own composition "Humoresque Oriental," a highly interpretative selection, with a final burst of continuous vibrant motion in Ries' "moto perpetuo."

The audience would not be satisfied but called him back again and again both for curtain calls and for encores. The intelligence, artistic interpretation and masterly technique of the artist left an impression on the audience, a large part of which were musical men, which will live long and brightly.
