## AKERS MEETS ESKIMO FLASH

Though Edleman's reputation suggests that Akers is in for a tough ten rounds or less, it is also pertinent to remark that this is the first time the West Salem boy has been matched at anywhere near his own weight.

Akers gave a good account of himself in his first fight with Pat Dundee and Jack Kentworth as well as against last noted adversaries in semi final bouts, and many of the fans consider him a coming champion at his weight.
