Here is a clever way to lengthen a child's linen or cotton dress: Turn under the bottom edge of the skirt Hemstitch it. Turn down the piece to be added and hemstitch it along the top. Then join the two pieces with catstitching. Use heavy thread and see that the stitches go into the holes along each edge.
