The potato inspector in the Portland field says that the potatoes on the early truck markets are of a quali-ty much superior to those of previous seasons and he be-lieves that the new standardfration law is to be credited largely for the improvement.

The greater part of the stock at present is sold as .U. S. No. 2, but as the season advances, U. S. No. 1 will predominate, Dealers who are exposed their pota-toes to sunlight are warned that a short time in such direct exposure will cause them to tern green and deteriorate in quality, Potatoes less than 1 1/2 inches in diameter must be marked as "Oregon Culis," and not "Oregon No. 3."

The potate inspector invites consultation of growers and dealers regarding the law and regulations govern-ing grading and marking. He can be reached through Atwater 4675 and Walnut 9288, Portland.




