**PERIL FROM FLOOD GROWING IN UTAH**

SALT LAKE CITY, Aug. 13—(AP)—Flood swept sections of Utah, working desperately to relieve the effects of mud and water that have destroyed farms, blocked highways and inundated homes, suffered new damage today.

To the south, north and west of this city, which has scarcely felt the results of heavy rainfall that sent mountain sides sliding down upon towns and farmsteads, the waters continued their destructive course.

At Centerville, some seven years ago today of a flood that took five lives, a new rush of water this afternoon damaged four more homes and deposited fresh layers of silt upon farm lands already buried. Residents, growing desperate, were preparing to leave.

In Dry Canyon above Provo five families were homeless when a cloudburst last night sent torrents of mud and debris over their farms, destroying all buildings. To the west of here the copper mill towns of Garfield and Magna were visited by new floods today when swollen overflow canals above them at the foot of the Ogkirk mountains gave way.

**EVANS STANDS PAT ON CLIFFORD CASE**

EUGENE, Ore., Aug. 13—(AP)—David B. Evans, Lane county member of the state game commission, said today he had no

apologies to make in regard to his vote last Monday to dismiss Harold H. Clifford, state game warden.  
 The announcement was made in reply to charges brought by Harry W. Poole, another member of the commission, that unsatisfactory methods had been used by Evans in the commission's executive session to effect the Clifford's removal. Poole has announced efforts will be made to re-instate Clifford.  
 "I have no apologies to offer and hold absolutely no regrets for

my vote in the Clifford-Clark controversy which was finally settled at the meeting of the commission Monday. The commission carried out extensive, thorough and comprehensive investigation of the charges against Clifford and Clark." Evans said in a long statement justifying his vote.  
 Some democratic leaders in Lane county see in the commission's action a move to have Clifford replaced by a republican. Clifford, a democrat, was appointed during the administration of Governor Pierce.
