

# COME INTO THE KITCHEN

**"Prohibition Punches"**  
 Grandpa had mint julep, Uncle favored his hot toddy, Grandmother sipped away daintily at a colorful punch of uncertain concoction, Sis swinging spike heels from atop a high stool consumes carbonated mixtures of unintelligible names, Brother in a low rooster of crimson hue pursues his drinks of high powered "Verboten" but Mother—when the sun glares down with a scorching ray and the mercury threatens to break its thermometer boundaries—Mother must entertain her bridge-club and casting about in her mind for something besides the usual coffee, cocoa or tea—cream, lemon, two lumps please?—well Mother wills.

**Ice Is Best**  
 I tell you, my dears—there's nothing so good for the lagging appetite, the wilted business man, the finishing touch to a summer luncheon or the most unusual surprise for the club refreshments as icy beverage.

The type of iced drinks will vary with the type of meal and the dishes served. Cold drinks must be served ice cold. Often crushed ice is mixed with them. A shaker or an electric mixer produces a cooler, better mixed drink. Tall thin glasses with dainty glass tubes instead of straws are usually used, though at receptions and large affairs of that nature, small handled cups are correct.

Along with the jams and marmalades in the preserve closet should stand rows of jars filled with fruit syrups of many varieties. These provide the bases for many of our drinks. Ices, ice creams, charged water and garnishes are also needed. Here is a general hodge-podge of drinks—some almost a meal in themselves.

Served with dainty nut bread sandwiches or a slice of sun-gold coconut cake, iced beverages provide a pleasing light refreshment that leaves the desired taste in one's mouth!

**Punch and Judy**  
 Juice of one-half lemon and one-half orange.  
 Mix thoroughly with shaved ice and fill glass with charged water. Add half a slice of each fruit and maraschino cherry as a garnish.

**Loganberry Cocktail**  
 Mix in a shaker six tablespoons loganberry juice and five each of lemon and orange juice, together with four tablespoons of sugar and some crushed ice. Pour into cocktail glasses and add charged water to fill. Garnish with a shaving of lemon twisted into a plain spiral.

**Grape Juice Ricky**  
 Juice of half lemon, small glass of grape juice and one teaspoon sugar. Pour back and forth in a mixer with crushed ice. Add plain or charged water.

**Ice Cream Puff**  
 To half a cup of any kind of fruit, two eggs broken into a mixing bowl, two spoonfuls of vanilla ice cream. Shake until well mixed. When mixed, fill with carbonated water (enough to make about four or five glasses) sprinkle with nutmeg. Extra ice cream may be added just before serving.

**Fruit Juice Cocktails**  
 There are usually served as a preliminary to a meal—usually in the living room. If preferred, the cocktails may be on the table when the guests are seated and are especially appropriate as a first course of midday's luncheon. The glasses should be arranged on small plates covered with doilies.

**Iced Fruit Juice**  
 Arrange four mint leaves lengthwise in a tall glass. Put in finely crushed ice to three-fourths depth of glass. Pour over it fill fresh fruit juice sweetened to taste, using grape juice, raspberry, strawberry or pineapple.

**Grape Ale**  
 Grape, mint and lemon with ginger ale is most delicious, using 1 cup sugar, 1 cup water, juice of six lemons. Add some fruit or mint leaves and let stand half an hour. Strain and add 1 pint red grape juice, 2 pints of ice in punch bowl ginger ale and one lemon sliced very thin. Use mint leaves for garnishing.

**Prohibition Punch**  
 Boil 1 cup sugar with 2 of water for five minutes. When cool, add the syrup from 1 can pineapple, 3 lemons, 1 orange, 1 pint grape juice. Put block of ice in punch bowl, add 1 pint of charged water or plain water and garnish with half slices of lemon and orange.

**Mint Julep a La Volstead**  
 Juice of 5 lemons, 1 bunch fresh mint, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 3/4 cup water, 3 bottles gingerale, ice. Mix lemon juice, mint, sugar and water and let stand 30 minutes. Add the ice and ginger ale.

**Iced Coffee and Tea**  
 Pour freshly made coffee or tea into glass half full of chipped ice. Cold tea or coffee may be used, but the flavor is not so good.

**Chocolate Float**  
 Add to iced cocoa—made as you choose—1 scoop vanilla or chocolate ice cream just before serving, garnished with a grating of chocolate. By adding 1 tablespoon of strong coffee to the glass before topping with ice cream—"Crook's Float" is achieved.

**Milk Shakes Shorts**  
 Fill a glass two thirds full of ice cold milk. Flavor with two tablespoons fruit juice, strained preserves or melted jelly. Fill with finely chopped ice. "Chocolate Short" is achieved by adding chocolate syrup to the milk instead of fruit juice. The addition of a spoonful of ice cream is better and richer than the ice. It may be partially stirred in or allowed to float.

**Egg Nog**  
 (Minus the Spiritual Uplift)  
 A few grains (1-3 teaspoon) salt to the white of 1 egg. Beat to a stiff froth. Add 1 tablespoon powdered sugar. Add to this the well beaten egg yolk and 2 tablespoons fruit juice. Fill glass with cold milk and sprinkle with chopped nutmeg.

**Orange Egg Nog**  
 Beat egg until light but not foamy, add 1-2 teaspoon salt, two teaspoons sugar, 1/4 cup orange juice, 1/4 cup cold rich milk

TOKYO, Aug. 20.—(Wednesday)—Six persons were killed in a violent eruption of the volcano Asama, northwest of Tokyo, at 3:30 A. M. today. The victims were all Japanese mountain climbers, four of them men, two women. They were caught in the flow of lava 2000 feet from the crater.
