Growers are warned that the work is only in the nature of an experiment and that orchardists are not advised to increase their acreage of peaches until the market for the preserves is established.

Reid-Murdoch plans to experiment with smaller prunes this fall in the manufacture of prune butter. No large quantity will be made and the future production will depend entirely on the way the product is received by the trade.



The crop would have been much heavier than last year since a much larger acreage will be harvested had it not been for adverse weather conditions early in the season. Blight has made sufficient inroad now that it is expected to hold the crop down to about 1000 tons.
