REGULAR AIRPLANE SERVICE AT START

Portland, Salem and Eugene will be connected by air on a regular schedule beginning Saturday morning, according to arrangements being completed by Lee U. Eyerly, superintendent of the municipal airport here, who will handle the passenger and express service.

The schedule now arranged is tentative, trips to be made two or three times a week to begin. The plane will leave Salem at 9:00 o'clock, going to Portland from where it will start the return trip at 9:45 o'clock for the south. 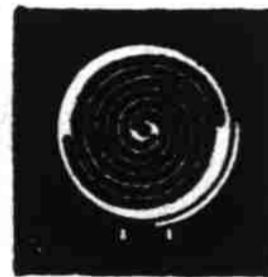
