

Woodburn's new Grade School to be Dedicated Tonight

NEW SCHOOL TO BE DEDICATED

\$18,000 Structure Will be Formally Accepted Here Tonight

WOODBURN, Oct. 9.—Woodburn's new \$18,000 school building, the Lincoln school located where the old grade school stood, is to be formally dedicated Friday, October 10. A varied and interesting program has been arranged for the event.

Andrew Presthus contractor who tore down the old school building and erected the new modern brick building this summer and C. N. Freeman architect who drew the plans will present the building to the school board. L. E. Thompson, chairman of the Woodburn school board will officially accept the building. Responses will be given by Mrs. W. J. Wilson, president of the Woodburn Woman's club, Harry Baillie, president of the chamber of commerce and Mayor C. W. Broyles.

The principal address will be given by James M. Burgess, one of the Oregon state department of education.

The program will be replete with musical numbers. Mrs. Jack Hansen and Mrs. V. D. Ball will sing a duet and the high school band will play several selections.
