

LEGISLATURE TENURE ISSUE

Old or new Members for Special Session is Moot Question

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Many following such election. "This is a general provision of the constitution; and under the usual rule of interpretation the special ranks ahead of the general; in other words the special provision governing the legislature would prevail over this general provision. In that case the newly elected legislature would qualify. It is of course a fine question of constitutional law. The governor may ask the attorney general for his opinion. However, in case either body started to function some one might raise the issue before the supreme court and either hold up the session or invalidate its acts if the court decided the wrong body had sat.

Question Not Raised Before

Attorney General Van Winkle when questioned yesterday said that the point had never previously been raised. Two previous special sessions held in 1920 and in 1921 occurred before the general election and not between the November election and the following January, so there was no question as to their membership.

It is a matter of some consequence because the convening of the old legislature means a "lame duck" legislature, just like the short session of congress. While in the present case only one item of legislation is suggested for consideration, a precedent is set so that it becomes of importance to decide which body is entitled to function as a legislature in the interval between the general election and the date fixed by law. In future years controversies might arise where "lame duck" legislatures sought to legislate in advance of the regular session.

The question will have to be decided if Governor Norblad concludes to call a special session.

CHARLES J. LISLE PASSES AWAY HERE

Mr. Lisle had been an active member of the First Methodist church and for the past several years had been attending services there. No definite arrangements have been made for funeral services.
