
MUSIC SERMON SUNDAY NIGHT

"Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever." In love and mercy He calls "if any man will come to Me, that he may have LIFE." But he who comes believably shall find LIFE in Him, and shall KNOW that he has passed from death unto LIFE.

JASON LEE MEADOWS MEET TUESDAY

J. J. Handsaker, Home From European Centers, To be Speaker

J. J. Handsaker, for many years the secretary in the northwest for Euro-Near East relief and peace movement in America, widely known in Salem will be the speaker at the Jason Lee Men's Brotherhood meeting on Tuesday, November 11. Dinner will be served at 6:30 o'clock by the women of the church, followed by community singing, a brief business meeting, and the address by Mr. Handsaker. All men in the community, young and old are invited.

The speaker brings a message from first hand contact with the peace movement in America. During the late summer and fall months he was in the capital cities of Europe, attended the session of the League of Nations council, and had unusual opportunity to meet the leading statesmen in Germany, France, Austria and England.

Mr. Handsaker is now secretary for the National Council for the prevention of war, and it was in company with Frederick J. Libby, one of the leaders of the peace movement in America, that he made the trip. He will tell the Brotherhood group his impressions of the nations as he saw them, and of the oft-impaired prospect of war, which threatens between Italy and France.

This opportunity will offer a close-up of world affairs by a shrewd observer, and it is urged that all the men who find it possible should plan to attend. Castle United Brethren Church Has New Edifice Construction Under Way

Construction of the new educational unit of the Castle United Brethren church, 17th and Nebraska street, will under way now, following completion of remodeling to both interior and exterior of the church parsonage.

At the present time, only the education unit of the building was voted by the congregation last spring will be completed. This unit will be supplemented later by the new church building proper, which will stand where the present church edifice is. The unit and parsonage remodeling will cost about \$20,000. Completion of the church structure later on will add another \$20,000 to the building expense.

The educational unit now going up is 42 feet by 76 feet, facing on Nebraska street, and will be composed of basement and two stories with 20 feet of the auditorium and the balcony also included. The entire building will contain kitchen and large dining room and two large classrooms.

A nursery, office, kindergarten department room, primary room, large chapel, parlor and kitchenette will be on the first floor. The second floor will house the junior department, assembly room and six classrooms, the intermediate department assembly room and three classrooms.

The walls will be of solid construction with brick facing. A semi-Gothic architecture will be employed, it will be seen from the drawing of the completed church on this page.

The Castle United Brethren church was organized on November 28, 1901, and was then located at 14th and Marion streets, with Rev. Newton J. Crawford as pastor. The church was named in honor of Bishop Nicholas Castle. Twenty-two years ago, during the pastorate of Rev. H. Frank Neff, the church was moved to the present site on 17th and Nebraska and the parsonage was built.

The committee handling the building project now under way is composed of the board of trustees and building committee, with the following members: W. N. Blodgett, J. F. Mollencock, W. W. Rosebraugh, J. C. Hill, W. A. Dunigan, F. J. Welsh and Rev. L. W. Biddle.

The Home Mission and Church Erection society of the denomination is providing a gift of \$5,000 and a loan of \$5,000 to enable the Englewood community, which the church serves, to have a modern church structure.

Rev. L. W. Biddle, the pastor, is serving his third year.
