The plum puddings are from an old English recipe and is just what plum pudding should be. The fruit cakes are from one to five pounds each and priced at 75c a pound and the plum puddings are made in cylinders weighing one pound each at 40c a pound. Then we have the Cresta Blanca Pudding Sauce with the old time tang at 90c a bottle and Martha Rush's hard sauce in 50c and \$1.00 jars. The Dromedary cranberry sauce, ready for the table at 25c per can and chestnuts for the turkey stuffing at 25c a pound. Our own make of mince meat at 20c a pound or the peas at 35c each. Then the Elsinore canned pumpkin in the large cans at 15 cents per can, enough for two plump pies.

Vegetables and Fruits

Stacks of fresh crisp vegetables that will add greatly to the perfect dinner. Solid head lettuce, celery, celery hearts, cauliflower, brussel sprouts, spinach, mustard greens, solid cabbage, parsnips, carrots, beets, Hubbard and Banana squash, tomatoes, cucumbers, artichokes, sweet potatoes.

New crop Cluster Raisins at 25c pound, Figs in packages 15c to 60c package. New Walnuts and Filberts at 25c pound, New Almonds at 28c pound and the shelled almonds at 59c pound.
