Hayesville—Miss Hazel Moran of Salem was a dinner guest at the Charles Reed home Thursday evening.

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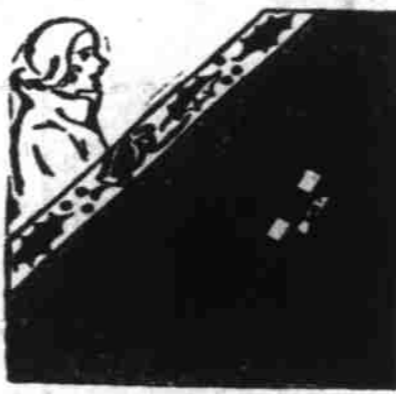
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
