Murderers of 4 Policemen Pursued Through Heavy Jungle Grass

RANGOON, Burma, Dec. 26the native machete hacked a way through the tangled jungle of the Tharawaddy district today, dragging machine guns along with them in pursuit of embattled natives who have murdered a government forest ranger and killed at least four policemen in the past two days.

Villages in the vicinity of Weys have been terrorized by the rebels, whose activities were attributed to discontent with the burden of taxation in a year during which the rice crop has been pitifully slim.

The marauding bands, which have apeared out of nowhere to battle the skeleton police guards, disappeared quickly again into an almost impenetrable forest and their pursuers have had the greatest difficulty catching up with them because of the difficulty of making any progress through the jungle and across

the rice swamps.
The center of the disturbance is about 70 miles north of Rangoon. At the village of Weya H. V. M. Fields, a government ranger who returned only recently returned only recently from a furlough to England, was overpowered in his lonely bungalow as he returned from an inspection tour and slain by the natives. 


