College Wins County
Contest

BRUSH COLLEGE, Jan. 28.—Outstanding among the agricultural committees of Polk county granges is that of Brush College grange which functioned in 1930. This committee has been awarded the beautiful ebony and bronze plaque which is being given by the Dallas chamber of commerce through County Agent J. Ralph Beck who has charge of the contest. The plaque will be presented to Wayne D. Henry, chairman of the agricultural committee by a representative of the Dallas chamber of commerce at the February meeting of Brush College grange and he will in turn present it to the grange. Rickreall was second in the contest. The winning committee included Wayne D. Henry, chairman, John Schindler, Ralph Allen, Fred Ewing and Alvin Madsen.

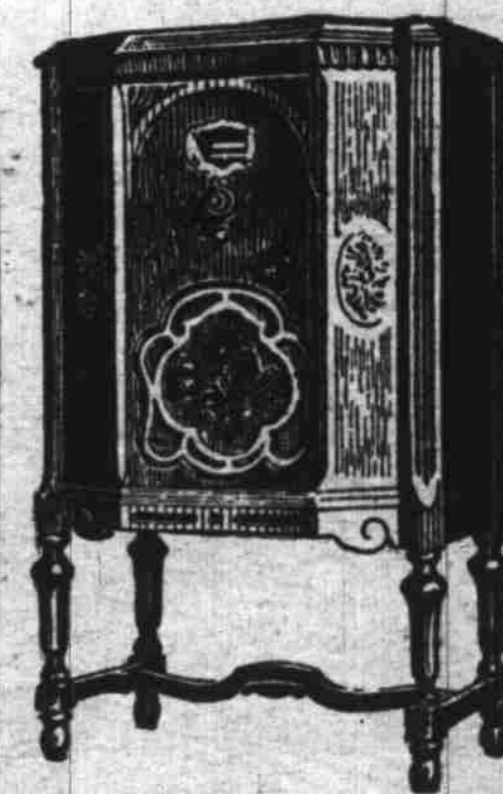
