life" like can openers, egg beaters and paring knives. Yes, and apple corers and egg floppers, measuring spoons and cork screws. About the time you rock your disposition and your fin-

gornalls with a treacherous grater, you'll believe love might truly enter into the picture, though. Ruined—one disposition by one stubborn can opener—re-sult cranky cook—love flies out the chimney—and there you are! In my cook's tours thru-kitchens I have observed that home keepers go to one or the other of extremes. They either resort to coffee cups and tea spoons for measuring and a treacherous knife and hammer alliances for

opening cans, or else fill drawer after drawer full of gadgets of inconceivable uselessness just because they happen to be new "homemaking devices" just on the market. Both of which habits call to mind two old proverbs—the Chinese says: "He who works without tools is twice tried"—while Socrates or some old Greek philosopher said centuries ago that "There are so many things in this world that I do not want. And aren't there?" In fact—"*Oh, the little things in life.*"

Which reminds me that if we are going to be known as a nation of can opener cooks, why not have a decent can opener and go at it openly and gracefully. By way of necessary equipment, I have concocted this list designed for the freshman crop of housewives or to serve as a guide to check by when you're taking inventory. Of course you can have more—but it will probably mean that you'll have more to wash. And you can get by with less—but for a smooth running workable kitchen we advise these tools.
