

PORTLAND, Ore., March 11.—
(AP)—Suit filed in federal district court here Tuesday by P. K. Mayers and V. K. Sturges, stockholders in the corporation, asked receivership for the Willaps Pulp and Paper Mills, organized three years ago as an Oregon corporation to erect a large pulp mill on Willaps harbor. Willapa harbor,

The bill alleged the mill has not been constructed and the funds have been dissipated. It asks that William D. Bennett, Portland, be named as receiver of all books, records and proper-ties of the corporation as well as \$14,900 on deposit with a Port-land bank. This amount is alleged to be all that is left of \$700,-000 said to have been in the

treasury at one time.

The complaint said the corporation owns 2,000,000 feet of timber in Pacific county, valued at \$120,000, as well as booming grounds, waterfront property, lime deposits, water rights and personal property and supplies valued at \$1,000,000.

The bill also alleges officers and directors failed to pay 1929 and 1930 taxes totalling \$6000 in Pacific county.

LIMA, Peru, March 11 .- (AP) Lieutenant Colonel David Samanes Ocampo fled to Lima Tuesday and became the new provisional president of Peru.

Samanez Ocampo, who was head of the "southern junta," set up by Arequipa revolutionaries until last night, when that junta re-signed as a move toward bringing peace to the country, drove immediately from the landing field to the government house.

There he was welcomed by Colonel Gustavo Jimines who had headed a transitory junta since last Thursday and invited Samanex Ocampo to become president. Some 8000 per sons massed about the palace and cheered until both leaders appeared for speeches. Jiminez stated the government was being handed to Samanes Ocampo because he was the best man to rule the country pending a return to the constitutional government.

The new president said he would work toward restoration of peace and would follow the ideals of Jimines, which look toward a speedy return to normalcy.

PANAMA CITY, March 11. — (AP)—Juan Ortis Tuesday lost his chance to be eaten by a lion. Ortiz, a young reporter, made a wager last week that he could enter the cage of a circus lion named Caesar and come out safely. The big event was set for Friday night.

But the mayor of Panama City attended the performance and halted the exhibition when it appeared to him that Ortiz would be hopelessly chewed up if he went in the cage. The mayor charged also that the circus management had purposely stirred up Caesar's gastronomic longings.
