STORES PRESENTED

Rotarians Hear High School Students Argue Merits Of Retail Systems

Rotary club members were at-tentive listeners Wednesday at a debate put on by a high school team on the chain store question. Harold Pruitt upheld the affirmative of the proposition that chain stores are a detriment to the public interest while Ward Horn combatted the proposition. Each speaker had ten minutes for opening speech and a four-minute rebuttal; and each used his

time effectively. Pruitt denounced chains, declaring that they did not contrib-ute their share to support of community enterprises, while the local independent stores were loyal to these causes; that the wages; and that they destroyed individual initiative. Horn based his defense of the

chains on the ground that they saved consumers money through increased operating efficiency. He defended chains on the score of wages by pointing at the low wages paid in the leading independent store of the state-the 'governor's own". He branded a lot of the subscription lists passed among the merchants as a racket which the chains did right in refusing to support.

Pruitt brought out that chain stores had grown rapidly in the last decade, handling now 18 percent of the retail business of the country through their 100,000
