

WASHINGTON, June 23 -(AP)-President Hoover's proposal of a debt moratorium pre-sented a new financial problem for the treasury today despite a declining federal deficit.

With the end of the fiscal year close at hand and indications that the deficit would be nearer \$850,-000,000 | than the \$950,000,000 forecast a month ago, the treasury faced the possible elimination of \$246,566,806 in foreign payments next year due to the proposed moratorium.

Under Secretary Mills however, the Hoover debt hollday would be a "very good invest-ment for the treasury if it turns the tide of business.

Mills believes an upturn in business would repay by increased tax cellections the losses through foreign debt.


