AIMEE PERMITTED TO CONTEST TAXES

WASHINGTON, June 24 — (AP)—Aimee Sempie McPherson today obtained permission from the board of tax appeals to continue her contest against paying the government an additional \$17,486 in income taxes.

The board overruled a motion by the internal revenue bureau to dismiss the application of the Los Angeles evangelist for a re-determination of her 1927 and 1928 taxes.

The bureau contended the application was void because it had not been signed by Mrs. McPherson. Llewellyn A. Luce of Washington, one of the evangelist's attorneys, explained she had not signed it because she was in Europe when it was presented. He filed an amended petition bearing her signature.

The internal revenue bureau assessed the additional tax on the ground she should have reported income of \$19,236 for 1927 instead of \$9,712 and \$107,395 for 1928 instead of \$18,488. The evangelist replied that she had reported all her income which was taxable.

In her petition she said the \$9,524 added by the government to her 1927 income was a gift from the congregation of Angels temple and not taxable. She explained it had been contributed as a "defense fund" following her widely publicized disappearance in 1926 to obtain evidence that she had been kidnaped.

PORTLAND MARKETS CITY WATER BONDS

PORTLAND, Ore., June 24.—(AP)—The city of Portland today sold \$500,000 worth of city water bonds, issued to finance water bureau construction projects, to a syndicate composed of George H. Burr, Conrad a Broom, Inc., Bankers company of New York, and Hannahs, Ballin and Lee. The successful bid was \$100,229.

There were nine bidders for the 4 per cent, 20-year issue, and members of the city council declared the sale price was exceptionally good.

The bonds were issued to pay for the construction of the Ross Island mains where about one mile of new line is being constructed to augment the west side water supply, and for other improvements and construction projects.

A group composed of Ferris and Hardgrove, and Barr Brothers and Co., Inc., submitted the second highest bid of 99.627.

M. M. Chambers Divorce Plaintiff Given Dismissal

Complaint of M. M. Chambers against H. D. Chambers from whom she sought divorce was dismissed when the contested action was heard before Judge Gale S. Hill here yesterday.

Judge Hill, in ordering dismissal, declared equities to be with defendant and that conduct of the plaintiff with a certain third party was such that she is not entitled to aid of the court or decree of divorce.
