Motorcycle races, arranged by and under direction of Harry Scott, will be offered between 3 and 5 o'clock, and between the races several novelty motorcycle exhibition thrills and spills will be staged.

For the races, some of the best riders in the northwest are participating, including Cody Evans, Salem, who has been drawing wide attention in the race meetings at Portland, Seattle and Tacoma; Marcus Kelly, Bob Duvall, Ray Grant, Holt Warrens and Bernie Carver of Portland. Amateurs expected to enter these races include Emil Jorgensen and Clyde Johnson of Salem who recently won events in the first Portland race meeting of the season; Otto Drager, Red Dahlberg, and Steven Flannigan of Portland, and Al Lob of Vancouver, Wash. Other entries are expected, with the grant total to bring together the largest number of machines ever assembled here for competition. Flying Baseball Team is Coming

The American Legion auxiliary, with Mrs. W. P. Watkins chairman, will have charge of the eating counters. Frits Slade is in charge of the finance end of the celebration and Tom Hill is looking after concessions.

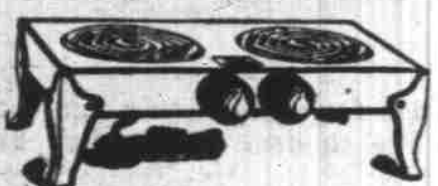

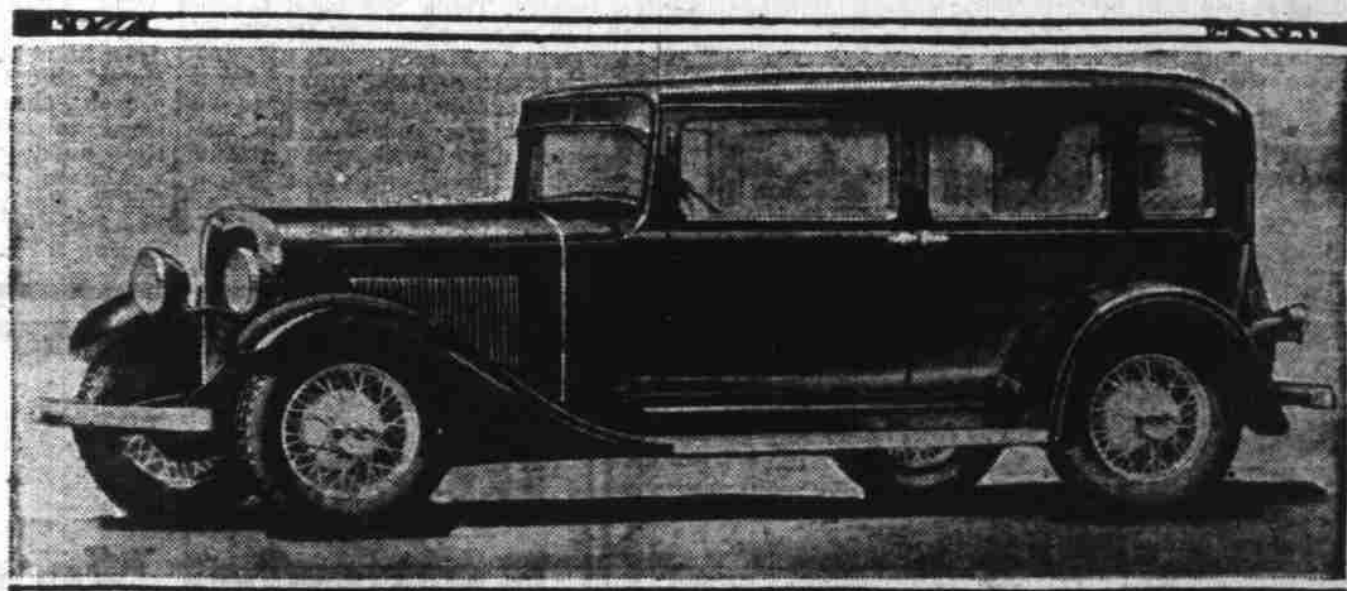
