It seems that the Independence boys are all "hopped up" over the strong team they have collected and are so confident of its prowess that they offered to play on the "winner take all" basis which is rather uncommon these days. It is also hinted that they are ready to back their team in other substantial ways.

Independence' hopes seem to be tied principally to a pitcher named Lysa who they claim is a better mound artist than Andy Peterson of the Senators. That there is something to their boasts aside from their confidence is attested by the fact that this team recently won from the Albany Alices who had Johnny Beck on the mound.
