

## GAIN MADE IN ATTENDANCE

Nazarenes Have Busy Summer and now Planning Winter Work

The Church of the Nazarene has maintained a busy summer schedule since moving into its new building at the corner of 13th and Center streets. The Sunday school has had an average attendance during the summer months of 176 which is a 33 per cent increase over the same months last year, and the attendance in the other services has been excellent.

Fletcher Galloway, pastor of the church, will speak from the subjects, "Why do Men go Away from Jesus?" and "Is the Average Christian Up to Par?"
