Mrs. Crawford, who was injured in an automobile accident while on her recent visit to California, is improving. Her friends hope that she will soon be able to be out.

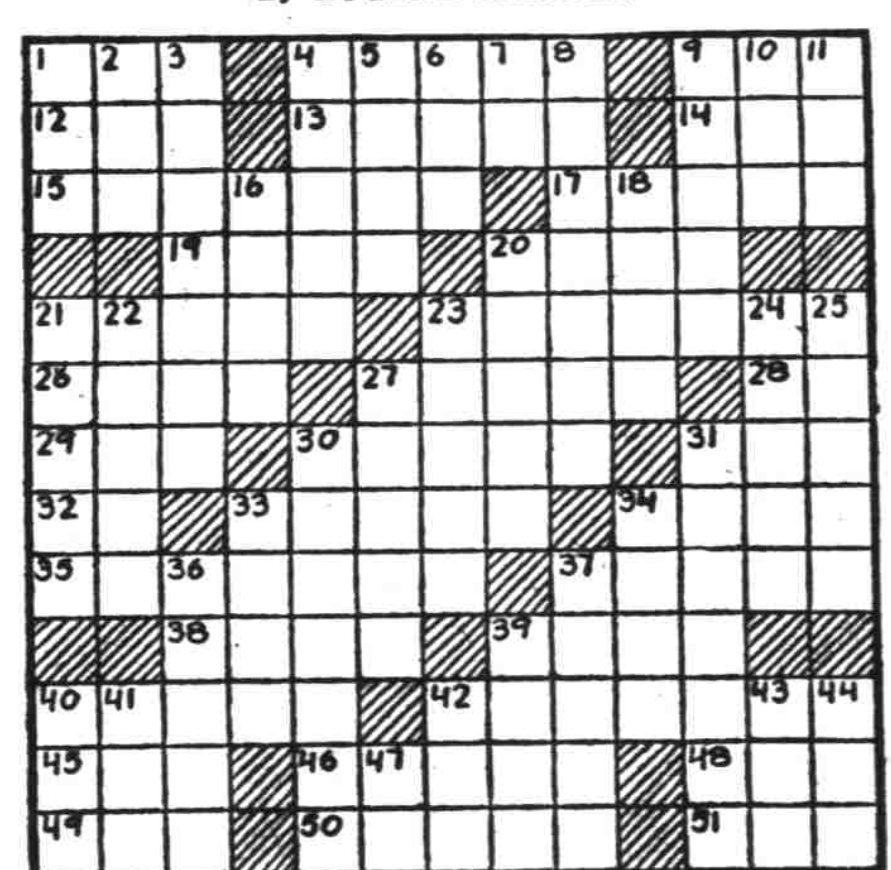
**Gervais People Here For Jones' Funeral**
