On May 12. 1871, Jacob and Nancy Conser sold for \$2000 to the Beaver Hosiery Manufacturing company 1,43 acres of land, as shown by the records of the Salem Abstract company. This was of course for \$2000 in stock of the company, On May 10 Absalom and Sarah Smith deeded to the company 96-100ths of an acre of land and a quarter of the right of way owned by Conser & Bur-nett for the ditch from the North Fork of the Santiam "to the saw mill now constructed."
