## LARGEST FIRE LOSS IN HISTORY KNOWN

SUBLIMITY, Jan. 20.—The 35th annual meeting of the Farmers Fire Relief Association of Sublimity met here January 16, with the largest membership in attendance that it ever had since its organization. Members were present from Salem, Woodburn, Mt. Angel, Scio, Dallas, Cottage Grove and Dayton.

The secretary's report shows insurance written during 1931 was \$349,305. January 1, 1932, there were 1063 policies in force insuring 214 buildings and contents for the amount of \$1,218,349. Receipts for the year were as follows: Premiums from new members, \$1442.78; assessments paid, \$2847.82; interest received, \$448.48; total receipts, \$5739.36. Disbursements, nine fire losses, \$659.97. This was the largest annual fire loss in the history of the association. Total amount paid for fire losses since organization, \$18,851.44.

General running expenses for 1931 averaged 77c per \$1000 of insurance in force. The average cost of the company covering a period of 35 years was: Running expenses, 90c per \$1000; fire losses, 98c per \$1000, totaling \$1.88 per thousand of insurance in force. Net resources of the association (net worth), \$6582.02.

J. M. Sehon, chief deputy of the insurance department, and Lester B. Davis, state fire marshal, were present and gave the assembly an instructive and interesting discussion on mutual insurance.
