

ACCIDENT BOARD IS FACING TWO SUITS

Two suits against the state industrial accident commission were filed here late yesterday afternoon, both plaintiffs seeking to recover larger settlements than

the commission granted when their cases were first presented. H. R. Kleper asks the commission to grant him \$150 for physician's services, \$38 a month for eight months and \$38 for four and one-half months for the loss of the third finger on his left hand in a woodsaw accident. I. A. Griffin asks the commission to award him \$25 a month for 64 months for alleged permanent disability. He says his total payment to date from the commission has been \$402.45.

HIGHWAY OVERHEAD BELOW 1 PER CENT

The average monthly payroll of the state highway commission administrative and engineering employees is \$59,065.31, or only 4.71 per cent of the total monthly expenditure, according to figures prepared by authors for the commission Wednesday. This does not include bond payments.

The average monthly cost of administrative functions, including legal service, auditing, cost accounting, stenographic and clerical services, and administrative engineering, is \$12,492.06. This is only .99 per cent of the total monthly expenditures. The monthly cost of construction engineering is \$37,234.08, or 2.97 per cent of the total expenditures. The cost of surveys and plans per month is \$9,369.31 or .75 per cent of the total monthly costs. Auditors for the highway department made it plain that these average costs were based on the year 1931.

A court struggle for the custody of Donald McNamara, 10, and Raymond McNamara, 13, which began early yesterday will be carried on today in equity court here today before Judge Gale S. Hill. Contesting obligations are the lady's father, Victor McNamara of Salem in whose custody the boys now are and their mother, Ois L. McNamara of

Everett, Wash., who seeks to regain custody of her children. When the McNamara's were divorced in 1928 at Olympia, Wash., the court there awarded the children to their father. Mrs. McNamara now claims she is entitled to rear them. She has brought her action as a habeas corpus procedure. The courtroom was crowded here yesterday to hear the trial.

PEACE TEACHERS GLASS REPEATED

So interested did the 43 teachers for the peace classes to be held during the coming six weeks become in the third of their preparatory meetings held at the Y. M. C. A. last night that they decided to meet there again tonight at 8 o'clock. Over 50 persons have signed up to serve as instructors. At tonight's meeting will be discussed further the problems of disarmament brought up last night. Mrs. O. A. Kells, chairman of the local committee for the National Council for the Prevention of War, announced that the use of 30 homes has been offered for the holding of the classes. She will endeavor to provide instructors for groups outside the city if there is a demand.

Topics to be taken up at the six classes, the first of which will be held next week, are: "Why We Must Have Peace," "The Menace of Armaments," "Disarmament Conference," "Organized Peace Machinery," "What You Can Do For Peace," "The State of the World Today—Summary of the First Five Classes."
