The blaze started about 4 o'clock from an unknown origin, presumably the flue, and had gained such headway before it started that it was impossible to check the fire, which spread to the fruit house and woodshed.

Mr. Williamson will rebuild right away. He has farmed here for the past 47 years, and has added vast improvements to the home place of 239 acres.
