

Benson Wins State High School Wrestling Championship

TAKES FIVE OF WEIGHT TITLES

Four Teams Split Rest of Them but Chemawa is Awarded Second

Coch A. P. Gibson & Co. of Benson Tech. Portland, made a brilliant clean-up in the state wrestling tournament, winning it handily by taking five of the nine events. The other four weight championships were split four ways with Chemawa, Salem, Corvallis and Franklin of Portland each getting one.

Chemawa won second place by having more men in the finals than Salem, Corvallis or Franklin. Five of the Indians reached the finals, three from Corvallis, two from Salem and only one from Franklin.

Hard working Little Albert Anderson won for himself and Salem the championship in the 115 pound weight, defeating the deft Pepton from Chemawa in an overtime match. Anderson was one of the youngest entrants in the tournament and following his win was paid a tribute by the Salem coaches as being one of the most faithful workers all season.

Meet Looks Close With First Finals
Frank Sulewski, stocky Polish wrestler from Benson, went straight through the tournament winning falls in every match including his bout with Sugal of Salem which he admitted was his toughest.

The first four championships went to four different schools and then Benson stepped out and took two more to clinch the winning of the championship. Before Benson got a strong lead in events won, Coach Gibson cautioned his men to wrestle for top time and to be careful of trying to take falls.

IOWA CITY, March 12—(AP)—Ossie Solem, football coach and athletic director at Drake university, today was named head football coach at the University of Iowa.

The signing of Solem climaxed a hunt of more than three months for a successor to Burton A. Ingwersen.

Solem was tackled and end at the University of Minnesota two years and an all western conference selection in 1914.

Drake has been unbeaten in the Missouri Valley conference since it was narrowed to a five team circuit four years ago.

Terms of the contract which Solem will sign here Monday were not revealed.

The contract is for three years.

State Hoop Tournament's New Elimination System Affords Places for Eight

Basketball fans have been wondering and inquiring, ever since the new elimination system for the state basketball tournament was adopted, just what it meant. Now that the tournament is just around the corner, their curiosity on the subject, if not already satisfied has been redoubled.

Early next week The Statesman will publish a diagram showing how the teams play. Meanwhile an attempt will be made to show just wherein the new plan is "double elimination" and wherein it is not.

Insofar as the championship itself is concerned, there is no change from the old system, except that with 16 teams it is simplified in that there are no byes. Sixteen teams play eight games, leaving eight in the running; they play four games and the race narrows down to the semi-finals, and so on to the finals.

But the new tournament plan does provide a definite goal toward which teams defeated once may aspire. It provides machinery for picking second and third place teams and so on down to eighth. Second to fifth place teams lose only one game each, sixth to eighth lose two each.

Obviously, a team defeated late in the tournament after winning some games, may be ranked higher than one which loses early. This is the logic on which this ranking is based. Now for a diagram showing how it is done. Eight teams play four games each, eight others play fewer games.

Ranking is provided only for the eight that play four games. In this diagram, "X" stands for games won and "O" for games lost. Here we show the records of the teams which win games, recorded from left to right in the order in which they are played:

XXXX champion.
XXX 2nd place.
XX 3rd place.
X 4th place.
O 5th place.
O 6th place.
O 7th place.
O 8th place.

The winners of second place in other words is the loser in the championship final. Third place goes to a loser in the semi-final which defeats the other semi-final loser. Fourth place goes to the second round loser which wins its remaining games against other beaten teams.

First place is won by a first round loser which wins all its later games played exclusively against other first round losers. Sixth place goes to the semi-final beaten last day by the team which wins third place. Seventh place goes to the semi-final beaten one game after that and then loses one. Eighth place goes to the first round loser beaten the last day by the winner of fifth place.

Explanation of the fact that only one team has each of the above records, is to be found in the bracket worked out by Roy S. Keene, manager of the tournament, which will be published early next week.

On top of all this, Charley Gelbert, the shortstop that the Cardinals need no more than their right eyes, has remained the most stubborn of holdouts. So has Chick Hafey, the league batting champion.

From California comes the echoes of serious gestures by the New York Giants and Chicago Cubs. Many experts are picking the house of McGraw to make it very tough for the Cardinal crew.

Tacoma is potentially a good athletic town and Sandberg is a football coach. College of Puget Sound will have to be considered seriously in choosing Northwest conference favorites for next season from present indications, which of course may all be changed by next fall, but which will doubtless not be changed to any disadvantage for the Loggers.

The game with Pacific here is bound to be a heat battle. The Bearcats were much more humiliated over the 7-6 defeat at the hands of the Badgers last fall than they were over the epic loss to Whitman. That Pacific game here November 16 is a natural and fans would be passing up a good bet by not seeing it.

The other two home games on the present schedule are with Albany college and with Monmouth Normal. While the Albany game will not be a four-star contest in all likelihood, the Monmouth Normal game will have in it an element which will go to produce a real game. Coach Larry Wolfe has established a reputation for himself with his scrapping club and his famous hidden ball play. There has been a little bickering over the back fence and this game will provide a touch of the same spirit which will be manifest in the Pacific game.
