

SEATTLE CHAMPION WILDCAT INVESTOR

So Avers Manny, Resident There; Urges Rotary to Aid Public Affairs

Hank Manny, Seattle, well-known to Salem Rotarians because of his service as district governor, threw a challenge to club members yesterday noon when he told them to get busy in public affairs and seek to save cities and states from extravagance and insolvency. Blaming the continuing depression in part on recklessness in public spending, Manny said the day of reckoning is at hand, and unless men of sound business judgment get in and work the country will go

to smash. Schools he put in the same category in urging postponement of further building. After referring to the difficulties of Chicago where teachers and employes have gone unpaid for months because of a tax strike when the tax load became unbearable, and New York where city officials had to beg a loan of \$131,000,000 at 6 per cent, and Philadelphia with a somewhat similar predicament, Manny posed his own town of Seattle as an example of extravagance run wild. "They built a dam on the Cedar river for a power plant, after three engineers said it would not hold water, spent three million dollars on it. The dam leaked, towns were washed away and the city had to pay thousands of dollars damages and there it is now a three million dollar monument of folly. Incinerators Won't Burn Label off Can "We spent \$1,400,000 for garbage incinerators that wouldn't

burn the label on a tin can let alone the can. Now they aren't used because they aren't usable. "We spent \$18,000,000 on port development and have to levy taxes to pay the operating losses and bond interest. Private docks are down and not being improved. "The street car property which causes a laugh everywhere else is no laughing matter to Seattle. Seattle bargained to pay \$15,000,000 for it at a time when it was assessed sixteen and a half

millions for taxing purposes. Seattle lost the 2 per cent gross earnings tax, the cost of paving between the rails, and property taxes, a total of two and a quarter millions in revenue. "Twenty-five million dollars have been spent on light plants and it will take \$10,000,000 more to finish them, generating 150,000 horsepower and be market for all the power. The city finished a four and a half million dollar bridge last September but

built no approaches to it and the job is now tied up in courts by injunction suits. "In closing Manny invited members to attend the international convention to be held in Seattle, and told plans being made to entertain the delegates from all over the world. 
