U. S. NEMESIS OVER TAKING BOMB FEINDS

The bomb outrage that cost the lives of three men in the Easten, Pa., post office disaster last December, had an echo in the capture of Colombo Boeri, 47-year-old anarchist, long sought for deportation, by United States Secret Service agents, in Chicago. Boeri was trailed to the Windy City by Murray Garson, Special Assistant Secretary of Labor, where he was masquerading as a grocer. In Boeri's home, Garson found a complete outfit for the manufacture of bombs, as well as a large quantity of ammunition and firetrum. The investigator declares that he has positive evidence to link Boeri with the dastardly bomb outrage that killed two post office employes and an explosive expert at Easton. It will be recalled that following the tragedy a widespread plot to wipe out prominent Italian sympathizers of the Fascisti was uncovered. Should Boeri, now held under \$100,000 bond, be convicted of the Easton bombing, he may be hanged in a public square in Philadelphia. Federal law provides that a person found guilty of murder on Federal property must be executed in the district where the crime was committed, with the United States Marshal acting as executioner.
