

We are not insinuating that this meat was not clean and wholesome in every respect, but some unscrupulous merchants have often taken advantage of this situation to mislead their customers, when they probably only had a few cuts of inspected meats in their store.

You are now assured that every pound of fresh meat bought and sold by this market from now on will be inspected and passed by a state meat inspector. This inspection fee will be paid by us. We will not have to raise our prices on that account. We believe that the increased business that will naturally follow THIS GUARANTEE OF CLEAN, WHOLESOME MEAT will amply repay us for any extra expense we incur.

Our market and methods of handling meats has always rated among the highest. At two of our recent inspections we score 95% and 97% out of a possible 100%.
