

THORSTEIN HORTEN DIES AT ZENA HOME

ZENA, April 20—Thorstein Horten, 67, passed away at the residence at Zena Tuesday, April 19. He leaves to mourn him his beloved wife, Mrs. Mary Horten, three daughters, Mrs. Alma C. Dickson, Portland, Mrs. Julia M. Gibson, Portland, and Miss Olga Horten, Zena, three sons, Anton and Theodore Horten of Zena, five grandchildren, Miss Easter Olen, Roger Horten, Theodore Rohne, Margaret and Robert

Dickson. One daughter, Mrs. Selma Olen, passed away April 2, 1919 at Lavana, Montana. Thorstein Horten was born at Yonge, Gulbrandsalen, Norway, February 23, 1865. He came to the United States in 1889, residing at Sioux Falls, South Dakota until 1918 when he moved with his family to Lavana, Montana where he resided five years when he again moved with his family to Portland, Oregon where he resided for six years. He was an employe of the Holman Fuel company while there. In 1929 they moved to Salem, residing on a farm 10 miles northwest of Salem in Polk county where he resided until his death. The deceased suffered a light stroke in September 1930, another one in February and the third and last April 11, caused his death. Funeral services will be held at 10:30 Saturday morning at Rigdon's mortuary. Interment will be at the Zena cemetery.
