

# Staters Win 20-19 Diamond Track Meet Over Bearcats

## BAT AVERAGES ARE FATTENED

### Gill's men win Series in Game Contrasting With Two Mound Duels

CORVALLIS, Ore., April 27.—(Special)—Base hits rattled like machine gun fire for three hours here this afternoon as Oregon State and Willamette university baseball teams played up runs in a three-game series. Oregon State finally noosing out a 20 to 19 victory despite Willamette's six-run rally in the ninth, which fell only tally short of tying the count.

Both coaches tried out all the reserve pitchers they could find but all were pounded badly. For Willamette, Fred Paul made the best showing, allowing only one run after he stopped the Staters' eleven-run rally in the sixth, which started while Doescher was on the mound.

Walt Erickson of Willamette, Johnson and Biancone of Oregon State smashed out home runs and other extra base hits were numerous. "Hot" Gibson, Willamette shortstop, took hitting honors for the day with five safe blows, one a double. Everybody who played the entire game connected for a hit with the exception of Erickson, Oregon State first sacker. Bearcats Get Seven in Early Assault

After Oregon State had collected four runs to Willamette's one in the first two innings, the Bearcats battled and walked around for seven runs and an apparently safe lead in the third. Four hits, four walks and a hit batsman made that story. Two more were added in the fourth, putting Willamette ahead 10 to 6, the Staters having added a couple in the third.

After getting two more in the fourth, "Stater" Gill's boys got hot in the sixth and seventh hits including a triple and four two-baggers, along with three walks and two errors, accounting for 11 runs.

Willamette added three to its total in the seventh on a free pass and four hits. Its desperate rally which produced six runs in the ninth was featured by Walt Erickson's homer, two-baggers by Gibson and Swanson and three singles.

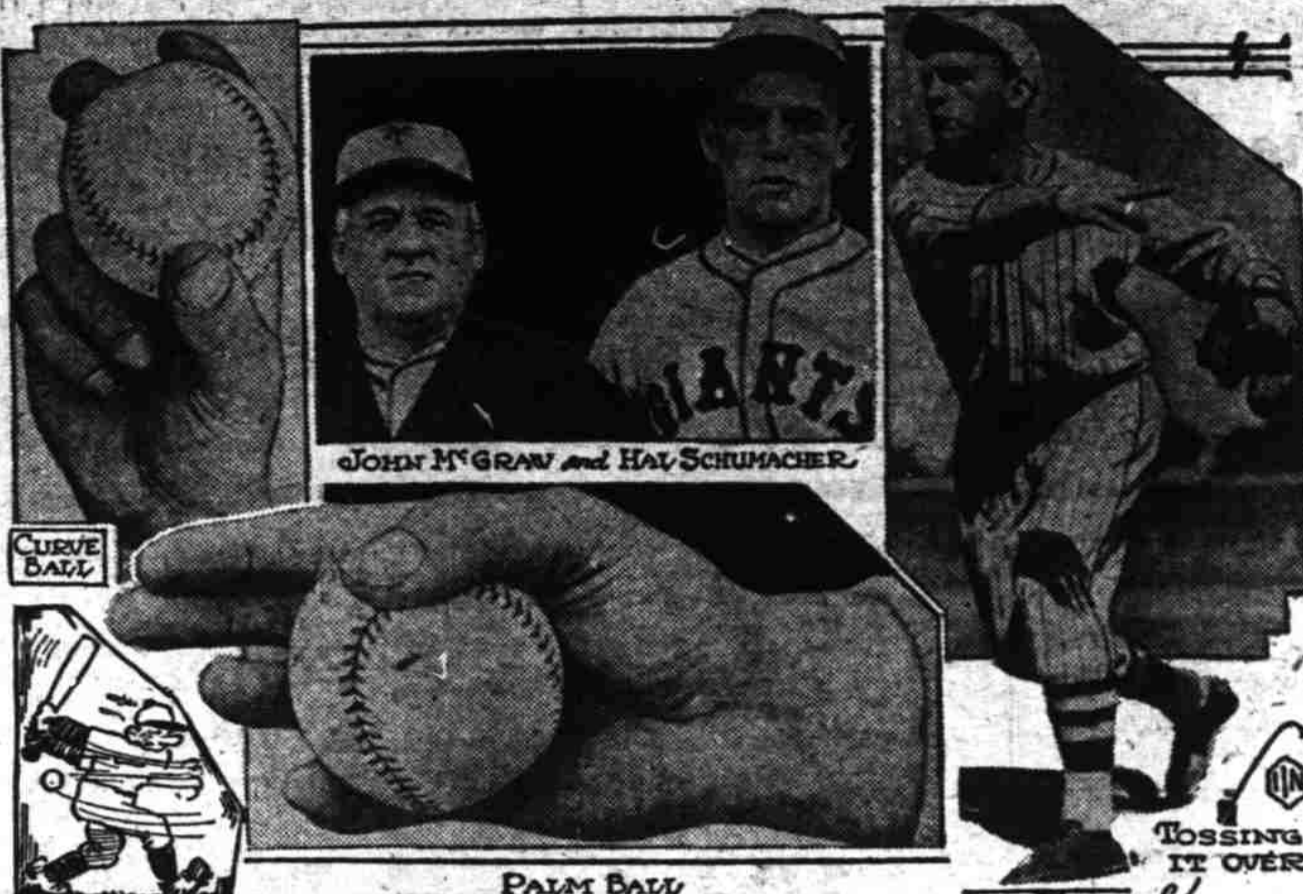
Friday of this week the varsity team will play Linfield there. The next day, Saturday, is open and Coach LaVelle says he is anxious to get a game for his team on that day.
