## SPURT IN BUILDING ACTIVITY PROBABLE

Many Plans are Submitted To Inspector; Credit Lack is Sticker

Possibilities of a sudden spurt in building activities in Salem are foreseen by E. C. Bushnell, city building inspector, in the number of persons who are coming to him to have plans and specifications approved. Business conditions, lack of credit, only seem to be causing the projected construction to hang fire.  
 When the notorious depression corner is turned, work is expected to go ahead apace on a large number of dwellings, at least one church and several business structures, according to the inspector. Many of the prospective builders have held plans for the various buildings for several months.  
 The Salem chapter, Oregon Building Congress, which has repeatedly sought to get these projects started, is now planning a "Builders' Day" in an effort to stimulate interest in construction work at the present time. Representatives of the congress, the Salem Ad club and the Woman's Greater Oregon association will meet at the Gray Belle at 6:30 o'clock tomorrow evening to plan for this event, which will be held on June 18.  
 Last week showed more activity in building operations than in the previous week in the matter of outlay although permits were fewer. Of the week's five permits, two were for new construction at cost of \$1250, including one dwelling, and three for repairs at cost of \$840. The total of \$2090 was nearly twice that of the preceding week.  
 While May was a poor month in respect to new permits for building operations, three major projects were being worked on which soon will be completed. They are the reconstruction of the fire-damaged Breyman and White blocks, erection of the \$4000 Pratt and Rasmussen-Carl B. Pratt and Rasmussen-Carl B. Pratt building on Ferry street near High, and of the new \$12,000 Jarman building in the 900 block on South Commercial street.
