Bogstadt and Charles Eppler of Eugene and Portland, and Chaplain Shalhean of the German Cruiser Karlsruhe, which stopped on its good will trip around the world at Seattle for two weeks and at Portland for several days.

Addresses and papers were given by representatives of every league in the Willamette valley league circuit. In the sermons and addresses almost every burning question of the day was touched upon in the light of religion, such as the depression, the liquor question, salacious magazines and literature, the modern dance, and the modern home.

Committees were appointed to secure a park site centrally located for convention and Bible institute purposes and to arrange for Bible institutes during the winter months.
