BOTH ANNIVERSARY OF CHURCH IS NEAR

On July 4, 1852, the First Congregational church of Salem was organized. In recognition of this the church committee has appointed a committee to arrange a fitting celebration. The members are R. J. Hendricks, W. I. Staley, Rev. W. O. Kantner, Mrs. Dan Fry and Mrs. E. J. Donnell.

Because the anniversary comes on a day when many church people will be out of town the major celebration will be held over until early fall at which time a number of interesting events will be featured.

Meanwhile, on Sunday, July 3, at 11 o'clock the anniversary will be commemorated in a special service of worship which has been arranged by the pastor and which will pay tribute to the founders and builders of the church. This service will include the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Junior Band to Advertise 4th; Gets Uniforms

The American Legion junior band will be seen in uniform for the first time here at 8 o'clock tomorrow night when it marches through the business district to promote interest in the July 4 celebration at the fairgrounds Monday. At least 20 boys will participate.

The uniforms consist of red and blue caps, white trousers and black caps.

With many boys joining, the junior band is fast rounding out into a balanced organization, according to Director W. H. McLaughlin. A number of new instruments have just been added.

Building Permit Total For June Is Not Exciting

Salem's building permit record for June was nothing to get excited about, falling below May and also below June a year ago. The report of Inspector Bushnell shows nine new permits for values of \$3942, 23 repair permits for \$3398, total \$10,340.

May showed 14 new permits, \$10,815; 45 repair permits, \$6,112.07, total \$16,927.07. Last June the record was 14 new permits, \$11,512, 43 repair permits, \$10,000.88, total \$21,512.88.

FIREWORKS DANGER WARNING IS ISSUED

With the jolly old July 4 rolling around again, the equally old danger of fireworks accidents pops up. It is against the latter that Dr. Frederick D. Stricker, secretary of the state board of health, warns in a bulletin issued this week.

Accidents from fireworks, being particularly liable to result in lockjaw, or tetanus, should be given very careful attention, says the doctor.

"There is no cure for tetanus or lockjaw; it can only be prevented . . . in case of a fireworks burn, immediate action is vital. There should be no delay in administering antitoxin, because where a diagnosis is certain it is usually too late . . . A physician should be consulted in all Fourth

of July injuries . . . Other accidents in which deep seated wounds in which dust and other particles have been crushed may also cause tetanus and the same precaution should be taken to prevent their infection."

Salem Beauty in Blossom Season Given Publicity

Salem's beauty during blossom season is well advertised in the May-June issue of the "North Coast", Northern Pacific Railroad publication, by a picture of local Cherrians in the K. B. Kugel orchestra.

DECREASE IN AUTO FUELS TAX SHOWN

A decrease of gasoline sales in May of more than two and a half million gallons over May of last year and resulted loss of about \$100,000 in gas fuels tax to the state was announced yesterday by the secretary of state. May sales were higher than the April record, however.

Total sales for May this year were 15,006,193 gallons, on which the tax collected amounted to \$325,804.67. Gasoline consumption for the first five months of this year aggregates 61,979,345 gallons, or a decrease of half million gallons under the same period in 1931.

The total tax collected this year is \$2,527,515.46 or about \$150,000 less than in 1931.
