

### LAND DEPARTMENT TURNOVER IS MADE

The state land department turned over to the state treasurer in June a total of \$49,242.43, according to a report prepared Thursday by George G. Brown, clerk of the state land board.

Items contained in the transfers follow:

Common school fund principal, payments on loans, \$15,541.16; common school fund principal, income sources, \$53.40; common school fund, interest, \$23,314.97; common school fund, abstract deposits, \$251; agricultural college fund principal, payment on loans, \$2602.68; agricultural fund, interest, \$945.79; university fund principal, payments on loans, \$48.45; university fund interest, \$318.27.

Rural credits loan fund principal, \$1019.83; rural credits reserve fund, interest, \$888.23; A. R. Burbank trust fund interest, \$45; J. T. Apperson fund principal, income sources, \$84.50, and P. T. Apperson fund, interest, \$12.95.

### BILL DELIVERY BY EMPLOYEES IS LEGAL

While the federal postal department has by law a monopoly on the carrying and delivery of letters, it cannot prohibit firms and individuals from evading the new postal laws going into effect next Wednesday by having their employees distribute bills and statements. Postmaster John H. Farrar said for the department at Washington.

The bulletin specifically warned against plans of firms and individuals to have their bills and statements delivered by contract. This practice is taken to be in violation of the federal statute giving the postal department its monopoly. Mr. Farrar said that no doubt existed as to the incivility of the law and that an interpretation of it might have to be asked.

Since the new postal rates will increase costs by one-third, many firms, it is understood have planned to abandon sending their monthly statements and bills through the mails. The Portland General Electric company has been distributing its bills under contract for several months. The distributor, however, is required to place the bills elsewhere than in mailboxes. It is said he is being paid less than a cent for each statement delivered.

### Knapp Arrested As Intoxicated

G. E. Knapp, 245 Myers street, service station employe, posted \$10 bail in municipal court Thursday following his arrest on a charge of intoxication. His arrest was the culmination of an automobile collision between Knapp's car and that of R. A. Higgins, Route 3, on Judson street during the noon hour Thursday. Higgins in his report to police said Knapp turned in front of him without warning, and that when Knapp got out of his car he smelled liquor on his breath.

### HORSESHOE CHAMPS WILL APPEAR HERE

C. E. Jackson and Guy L. Zimmerman, horseshoe pitchers of wide renown, will make several appearances in and near Salem within the next few days. They are scheduled to perform at 12th and Mill streets today at 2:30 p. m. and at 17th and State tonight at 7 o'clock. There will be no admission charge.

They will also be at Hazel Green park Sunday, July 2, for a performance at 2:30 p. m. At all of these appearances difficult stunts will be performed, such as ringing the legs of the chair in which the other player is seated, knocking a hat from a man's head and making a ringer on the same pitch, ringing stakes hidden behind blankets, making ringers through loops of each other's arms.

Zimmerman is holder of the Iowa, Illinois and South Dakota championships, while Jackson formerly held the Iowa and Illinois titles and has been among the leaders five times in national tournaments.

Zimmerman holds a record of 19 double ringers pitched consecutively in match play, 1025 ringers in 1200 shoes pitched. Jackson has a record of 87 ringers out of 100 pitches and 39 ringers out of 40.
