Marion county spent \$237,926 during the first six months of 1932, the county clerk's office reported Thursday. Outgo from the general fund was \$95,195. The largest expenditures went into county and secondary roads which took funds aggregating \$125,000. County road expenditures were \$47,232, market road outlays were \$29,818, market road maintenance \$14,451, while expenditures for the district roads in the county were \$42,458.

"This column has before contained the story of the lost coin in the glove finger. Other authorities called it a picaquery. The purchase of the three needles enabled Grandma Brown, then in her 67th year, to ply the trade of glove maker and enter the business of glove merchant, and she was soon on the way from near starvation and nakedness to comparative independence, and in a little while was proposing to undertake the opening of her boarding school, that led to the chartering of Pacific university."

But this writer has not before established the fact that the "house of a Methodist minister" was the Lee house, at the present 960 Broadway, where Tabitha Brown found welcome, food and shelter, and opportunity to

begin to recuperate her shattered fortunes, and to renew her dreams of service to her day and generation, for which she had followed the gleam to the loss of everything but the clothing that barely covered her shivering body—everything but her splendid spirit and her faith in God, and her dauntless courage in facing problems however difficult.

A member of the Virgil K. Pringle family, Mrs. Pringle being a daughter of Grandma Brown, writing some years ago said: "When the Pringle family reached the top of the last hill, overlooking the present city of Salem, and saw the three-story Willamette Institute and the parsonage, both painted gleaming white, surrounded by the lovely valley, they really felt as if they had seen a view of paradise. This was Christmas day, 1846."

### Wanted to Recover Her Shattered Fortunes

The view was from the Polk county or Eola hills. What they saw was the Mission Indian Manual Labor school building of the Methodist mission, that in 1884 had been purchased by the Oregon Institute trustees, and opening classes of the Institute had been started there August 13 of that year. And the parsonage they saw was the second dwelling erected in what became Salem, then standing where the Kay woolen mill tower is now, and at present at 1325 Tupper street.

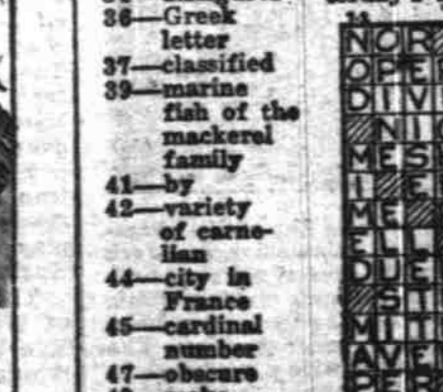
