NEW YORK, July 7-(AP) .-Stocks lacked the stamina to withstand a late selling flurry today and closing prices of many leaders were 1 to 3 points net lower. An early decline found the mar-

ket fairly well fortified with buying orders, but all it could do. on the whole, was to erase losses before turning downward again under increased pressure. Here were a few pronounced airpockets. Late Lausanne advices received here during trading hours spoke optimistically of a settlement.

Wall street appeared to have concluded that tre relief battle being waged between congress and the White House presaged an extra engagement which might extend well into the summer, and possibility of such a session was freely mentioned in brokerage circles as reason for the closing heaviness. Conspicuous weakness cropped out in International Shoe which

dropped 6% to 20% and finished near the low. The company's first half earnings were less than dividend requirements and the shares fell swiftly.

# STEADY TO FIRMER

## To Bring Advance; **Board Watched**

CHICAGO, July 7-(AP)-Despite a lively late advance due to eastern buying of wheat, the grain markets wilted at the last today under increased pressure

to sell. Fear of liquidation by the federal farm board was asserted in some quarter to have prompted the final outbreak of selling. Other observers said much of the selling was of a hedging character that better weather prevailed for domestic harvest operations, with receipts at some southwestern points increasing, and that spring wheat news was

still predominatingly bearish. Wheat closed unsetlled 3-8-7-8 under yesterday's finish, corn 1-2-1 down, oats unchanged to 4 lower.

#### Eastern Buying Fails Reduction of Over 10,000 Bales in Oregon Crop Caused by Mildew

CORVALLIS, Ore., July 7-(AP)-Hop markets on the Pacifi. coast were steady to firmer during the last month, though somewhat less active, said the monthly government review received today by the O. S. C. extension selec co-operating with th. U. S. D. A. bureau of agri-

cultural economics. Production is estimated at about normal along the coast except for a reduction of 10,000 to 15,000 bales in Oregon by the hop mildew. Holdover supplies on the coast are about 3,000 bales fewer than a year ago.

Sales in the three Pacific coast districts totaled around 3700 bales at prices little changed from a month ago. Prevailing prices in Oregon markets are 121/2 cents to 13 cents net to Wheat: July old, .48 1-4-3-8; grower for best grade '931 clus-July new, .48 1-4; Sept. old, .51- ter. Yakima sales are reported at 10 % to 11 % cents, at Puyallup at 11 1/2 cents. In California where the harvest will soon start, prices range from 9 to 11% cents, with trading mostly at the higher figures. Demand is almost wholly from domestic consumers in the mid west and east, with practical-

ly no foreign inquiry or demand. Warmer weather in Oregon seemingly has checked the milde r, although lice and red spider are causing growers to spray. The new crop is making good progress in all three main coast producing sections with June weather satisfactory. The Sacramento territory expects a crop of 16,-000 to 17,000 bales compared with 12,000 last year when hot winds curtailed production. MISS HOWE SPEAKER


