The territorial legislature of '52-'4, its sessions in the Nesmith and Rector buildings, next to and back of the present Statesman building, chartered the Oregon & California Railroad company, to build a line from Portland and Oregon City to Eugene. James Hetherly, the "sorry immigrant" of '51, was named as one of the railroad's commissioners, along with James W. Nesmith, Henry Owen, Wm. Barlow, J. L. Park, Joseph Holman, R. C. Geer, W. H. Rector, Dan Waldo, B. F. Harding, Dr. W. H. Willson, Hugh Cosgrove and other early and prominent pioneers. The Oregon & California Railroad was built, and became a part of the Southern Pacific system.
