INDEPENDENCE COW SETS HIGH RECORD

Among Oregon Jersey cows making high production records as shown on the books of the Oregon Jersey Cattle Club, are Reuben's Marina, owned and tested by M. N. Tibbles of Independence, and Harry D. Hilt herd at Independence.

Reuben's Marina recently made the remarkably high production record of 732.43 pounds of butterfat, 9547 pounds of milk in a 365-day official test started when she was 23 months old.

In the purebred Jersey herd owned by Hilt, one of the cows, the Marina's Xena, has won a silver medal award as a junior 2-year-old with a yield of 494.29 pounds of butterfat, 6,599 pounds of milk on a 365-day official test.

An outstanding production record has been compiled by Reuben's Marina, one of the purebred Jersey cows in the herd owned by W. H. McKee, Perrydale. This cow produced 707.63 pounds of butterfat, 11,000 pounds of milk in a 365-day official test, made in her eighth year. This cow, in her third year, won a silver medal for creditable yield offered by the American Jersey cattle club.
