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WALL STREET TREND IS SLUGGISH SPRING WHEAT FORECAST BULLISH

Gotham Traction and Tobacco Provide Some Power

NEW YORK, July 19.—(AP)—Stocks dawdled today, responding so apathetically to professional operations in one or two groups that efforts toward a revival of the advance were abandoned. Closing prices represented almost a draw between minor advances and declines, with losses favored by a shade.

New York City traction and the tobacco gave a bullish tinge to the market for a time. The former received their inspiration from unification developments; the reasons for the latter's little flurry were not clear. Bonds about managed to hold their own in another dull session.

Some of yesterday's weak spots hardened, notably Dupont which seemed untouchable by its earnings report. Utilities were firmer. People's Gas rallied moderately as it became known that re-funding operations for the Insull group's forthcoming maturities were to be undertaken soon. American Telephone and Consolidated Gas improved fractionally. Ralls tried to be hopeful over the outcome of the executives' conference, but got little real inspiration therefrom. American Tobacco "B", Reynolds "B" and Liggett & Myers "B" held part of their extreme gains of around a point. U. S. Steel was steady, although Preferred lost 1-3-8 net. Brooklyn-Manhattan had a 2 point rise. It was the dullist day since June 20, sales totaling 468,890 shares.
