

Doc Nelson to Wrestle Henry Jones Here Tuesday Night

TITLE BELT TO BE PRESENTED

Newcomer Ex-Gridder and Scientific Attacker of Nerve Centers

Having been allowed two weeks to recuperate from the thrills of championship grappling, wrestling fans will return to the armory next Tuesday night to see something new: a first class chiropractor plying his trade on the mat. Henry Jones, who won the world welterweight crown from Robin Reed here last week, will meet "Doc" Nelson, the aforementioned nerve specialist. In addition to studying medicine and allied healing arts at the University of North Carolina for six years, Nelson found time to star on the gridiron.

However, unlike many footballers who turn to wrestling for a livelihood, Nelson uses what he learned in the classroom rather than the headlock methods of the mauler. He specializes in chiropractic headlocks and attacks upon the nerve centers, location of which he ascertained while learning to doctor ailing mankind.

A few weeks ago Nelson met Robin Reed in Portland in a match billed as for the championship. Reed won, but only by last-ditch strategy. Henry Jones will be presented.

Tuesday night the fans also will witness, according to Matchmaker Harry Plant, the presentation of the world welterweight belt to Henry Jones. This has been held up pending receipt of word from the Midwest Wrestling association which sponsors the belt, as to the arrangements Jones must make. All that says Plant, has now been adjusted.

In the meantime Onas Olson, secretary of the boxing and wrestling association, declares he is the champion, as he has custody of the belt.

Emil Firpo, said to be the welterweight champion of Argentina and a cousin of Luis Angel Firpo, "Wild Bull of the Pampas," will be here to meet Joe Gardiner in one preliminary and Salior Arnold will make his bow against Prof. Newton in another.

CURT COMMENTS

Can there be a nine-inning baseball game in which one team does not make 27 put-outs? Ralph Mason, who does a lot of umpiring, was telling us how it could be done and we didn't say yes and we didn't say no. But we thought no.

And such a thing may be possible but anyway we score a put-out on Mason. He said it would happen in case a base-runner was hit by a batted ball. The runner is out and the batsman is credited with a safe hit. But, said Mason, nobody would get credit for a put-out.

Now umpires have to know the rules better than players and also better than sport writers. Mason does know the general baseball rules better than we do. He beat us a while back in an argument on what constitutes a foul ball or a fair ball under certain circumstances. But we will now quote a portion of Rule 70, Section 7:

"When a base-runner is declared out because of being hit by a batted ball, the putout shall be credited to the fielder nearest to the ball at the time of the occurrence."

Yes, Billy Sullivan tried catching and instead of one error, made two. The Red Sox stole four bases in that game but we don't know how many after Billy donned the protector.

Have Tasted Blood, Hungry For More; Shakeup is Bringing Results

The Bend Elks, who suddenly came to life last Sunday and swamped Pacific Outfitters 20 to 11 after losing all their previous games, will invade the home of the Salem Senators, presumably in the mood of so many wildcats who have tasted blood and hunger for more.

The Elks have been shaken up. Ray Eubanks, veteran catcher, is now playing second base and Don O'Leary, Columbia university catcher who has appeared here several times with the varsity team, is doing the backstopping. Pete Allen, another old-timer who has been here with Bend teams in the past, is back at first base and leadoff man.

This Bend team has plenty of sluggers, including Bob Board, former Yamhill county boy who is one of the two or three league leaders in the hitting column. Every man on the Bend team hit last Sunday and all those who played through the entire game, with one exception, got two or more safe bases.

Other players whom Salem fans have seen in the past include "Spec" Kennedy, ex-minor league outfielder; W. A. Wood, manager and shortstop, another fence buster; and Weedman, center field. The chief hurler at present is Clyde Wunder, who lives at Independence and is known to local fans and ball players.
