## HOLT AND GRAVES TEAMED UP AGAIN

### "War Correspondent" now At Elsinore; China's Strife Depicted

The reunion of Jack Holt and Ralph Graves, those two-fisted men whose bitter rivalry was featured in the spectacular films, "Flight," "Dirigible" and "Submarine," brings together in a new Columbia release, "War Correspondent," one of the most popular teams in the history of the movies. Lila Lee also is featured in "War Correspondent," which has civil war in modern China as a background for the daredevil exploits of the Holt-Graves team. The picture will be shown at Warner Bros. Elsinore today and Monday.

The bringing together of Holt and Graves, focuses the spotlight on the large number of memorable teams of actors which have proved such ideal foils for each other — either in a hard-boiled way, such as Holt and Graves, or in a romantic way, such as Greta Garbo and Jack Gilbert or, in comedy, Bobby Wooley and Bert Wheeler. These teams have proved very popular with movie-goers. Sometimes when producers have split them up and let them go it alone, the plan has worked, but more often the movie fans have resented the breaking up of what they regarded as a perfect combination. The Holt-Graves combination has always proved a great attraction for the plaudits of movie audiences.

In "War Correspondent" Holt plays the role of a recklessly adventurous American aviator, who fights as a soldier of fortune in a Chinese army, while Graves has the characterization of an up-to-date radio-newspaper war correspondent. The girl over whom they battle is charming Lila Lee. This is not the first time that these two men have struggled for her favor—she was with them in that phenomenal success, "Flight."

## 'WOMAN IN ROOM 13' IS AT GRAND

### Neil Hamilton, Its Star, Recalls Advice From Famous Griffith

Neil Hamilton, who plays an important role in Elissa Landi's latest Fox emotional drama, "The Woman in Room 13," opening today at the Grand, dates his success as a screen star back to the time D. W. Griffith called him aside from a scene and gave him a good sound piece of old-fashioned fatherly advice.

"Son," the great director said to Hamilton, "the only way to make an impression on the screen is to dominate every scene you are in with sheer personality." Hamilton listened attentively, but just how to dominate scenes in which he appeared with stars and notable players was not clear to him until Griffith continued: "Size and physical appearance have nothing to do with personality. You simply must raise your chest, when you walk into a room, and the attitude mentally that you are of importance and you will find that everyone about you will instinctively glance your way. Look at Napoleon!"

With this advice in mind Hamilton continued his acting career which he had begun in Long Island film studios, after running away from his home in Athol, Mass. And it brought immediate results. It was very soon afterwards that he was cast in the role that started him up the ladder of the younger brooms in "Mean Streets." And it was this mental attitude that helped him make the very best of that role and to win other leading parts in such pictures as "This Modern Age," "The Great Lover," "Dawn Patrol," "Strangers May Kiss" and "The Sin of Madelon Claudet."

Ralph Bellamy, Gilbert Roland and Myrna Loy are the other featured players in "The Woman in Room 13," which Henry King directed.

## HELL FIRE AUSTIN IS AT HOLLYWOOD

### Ken Maynard Real Bronco Buster; Cashes in on Boyhood Ambition

Some years ago, in Mission, Texas, a small boy watched with awe and admiration the local exhibition riding at rodeos and roundups. And so it was with a head full of thoughts of trick and fancy riding that Ken Maynard moved with his family across the plains to Columbus, Ohio.

Townpeople of Columbus today recall the gangling son of a building contractor as he spent his days on a beaten path astride a little bay mare practicing all of the tricks he had seen. He soon became one of the "main events" in civic entertainments.

While still a youngster he joined a wagon show, carrying feed and water to horses and sleeping in stables. He saw service then with several circuses, risking his life in daredevil stunts over the uneven turf of the big top in the "after performance" wild west shows.

Ken won his first honors on the back of one of the wildest bronchos known to the cowpuncher world when he was named the greatest trick rider at the world's championship cowboy test in Chicago in 1920.

But one other hobby than riding holds Ken's interest. This is flying an airplane. During the last three years he has had a total of 1,000 hours in the air.

This cowboy who became famous by bull-dogging steers, riding outlaw horses, doing trick and fancy roping and riding and "busting" mustangs is coming to the Hollywood today, in "Hell Fire Austin," his latest western picture for Tiffany Productions.

## INCUBATOR HOUSE BUILT BY WARNER

### Has Last Word in Sanitation; Hard Times are Given "go-by"

RICKEY, Aug. 20—One of the best and most progressive farmers not only in this community but in Marion county is C. A. Warner who owns and operates the Pudding River Stock farm. Not only does Mr. Warner keep his farm up in good condition and raise crops hard to equal but takes a pride in his livestock and raises pure bred Cotswold sheep, Yorkshire cattle, Berkshire pigs and Rhode Island Red chickens.

Though he could not dispose of his loganberries this year and egg prices are low Mr. Warner has not gone on a "strike" but is building for the future and is keeping his fields in fine condition and has erected an incubator house that would be not only a credit in appearance to any farm but the interior is a work of art in construction for sanitation.

The building is of tile and plastered inside with cement. It is well lighted and ventilated, facing the east and with small windows arranged near the floor on both east and west. The windows may also be tilted to let in air but are so arranged that the chicks cannot be caught in them. The roof on the east side extends, forming a protection over the cement floor or "porch." The house is heated by stoves. A sanitary water supply is available by an especially constructed arrangement. At the south end is a feed room 8x10 feet long. This makes it easy to do the feeding and is much more sanitary than having extra feed in the brooder house proper.
