RAILS LEAD RAILLY TO HIGHER GROUND

NEW YORK, Aug. 24.—(AP)—Prices backed and filled in considerable confusion during most of today's session in the stock exchange, but a sharp runup in rails in the last hour pulled the general list higher.

Some of the more thinly traded rails shot up about 5 to 12 points, but most gains at the finish were limited to a point or two. The market absorbed rather heavy profit taking in most of the leaders in the middle of the day, many of which were off temporarily from 1 to 3 points, but most of this recession was recovered later. Turnover of 3,691,500 shares, was some 900,000 less than yesterday.

Delaware and Hudson, which is left independent in the merger plan, shot up to close 12 1/2 points higher. Reading, which reported July net of \$645,775, against last year's \$136,335, shot up 10 points to 48, a new high for the year.

But Lehigh, which reported a moderate operating deficit for July, against a small profit a year ago, also reached a new high for the year, and closed up more than 5, net.
