hop yard which is the property of A. F. Beardsley is one of the largest in the state. Finley reports that this year's crop is of good quality and thinks the picking will last about three weeks.

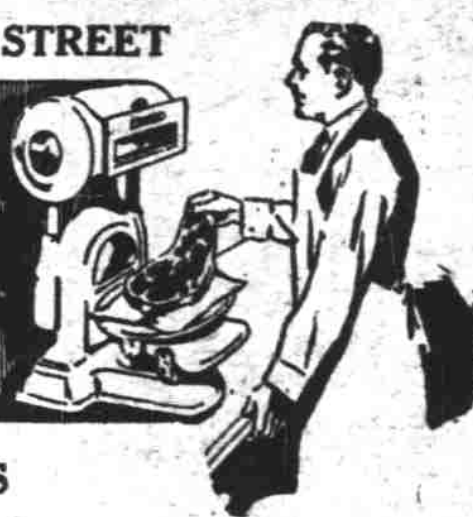

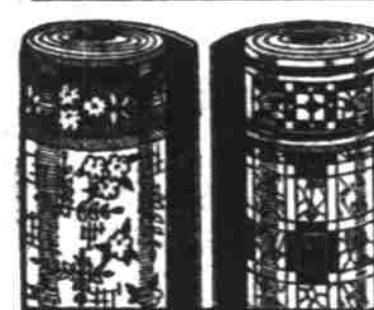

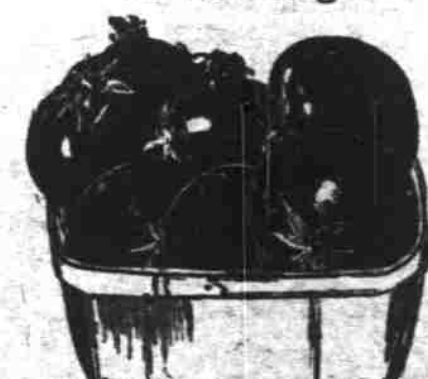
