SERIES GATES LOOK RECORD

Leaders say With Cubs on Field Attendance Mark Endangered

By ALAN GOULD Associated Press Sports Editor NEW YORK, Sept. 9 (AP)—It appears likely the Chicago Cubs furnish the opposition to the New York Yankees, records for attendance and gate receipts figure to be shattered in the forthcoming world series, which, it was decided today, will open Wednesday, September 28, at the Yankee stadium.

Meeting today with Commissioner Landis to arrange details for the world series, the magistrates decided to make no change in the price of tickets. Thus, a capacity turnout for the opener or at any other game in New York would break the record of \$3,600 cash customers, set at the Yankee stadium in 1928, and the mark of \$224,130 for gate receipts, made in 1928 at the same park.

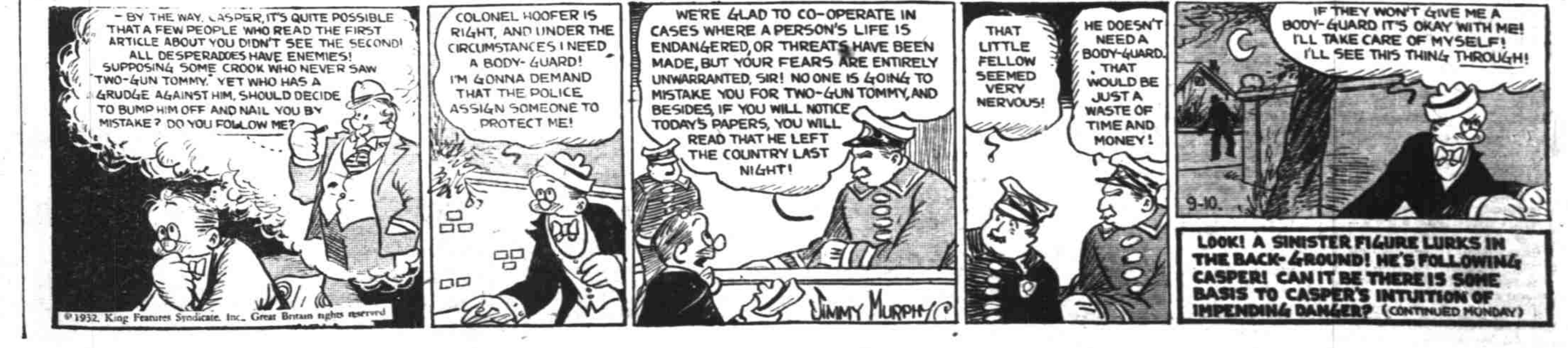
