EUROPEAN BUYING HELPS GRAINS BUT GAINS SLIGHT EGG PRICES GAIN CENT LOCALLY

CHICAGO, Sept. 15-Immense buying of Canadian wheat for Europe together with overseas purchasing of 500,000 bushels rom this country, put backbone into grain values today.

About 4,000,000 bushels of Canadian wheat was taken today by trans-Atlantic shippers, making upward of 1 ,000,000 bushels this week. Another stimulating factor was knowledge the price spread between Chicago and Liverpool had widened greatly, with the difference the sharpest witnessed

in many weeks. Wheat closed firm, %-1 above esterday's finish, corn %-% up, ats unchanged to 1/2 higher. Today's closing quotations:
